Welcome to Spring! Even though the winter was very mild and "snow free" for the most part, it still is wonderful to welcome this new season. Spring always makes me think of growth and renewal. Growth and renewal are two words that could easily be applied to CLAPW with all that is going on at the agency. As I write this, we are beginning the process of developing our next strategic plan which will be used to guide our work over the next four years. We plan to continue to build on the progress of our last plan and ready ourselves for the changes to come to the developmental services sector through the implementation of the MCCSS Journey to Belonging.

Our family group, funded by the Ontario Caregivers' Organization, continues to meet and is expanding thanks to the leadership of parent and board member Sylvia Thornton. If you want more information about this family group, please reach out to Sylvia at sylviathornton99@icloud.com.

Over the winter, people involved in community participation supports at Dowty sliced, diced, and created wonderful hearty meals for people involved in our Supported Independent Living program. This effort was made possible by a Partnership Grant from the Town of Ajax and was key to ensuring that people had their nutritional needs met at a time when food prices were soaring.

And with thanks to the Durham Community Foundation, we have been able to buy air conditioners for people involved in our Supported Independent Living Program. We are grateful to our community partners.

Although disappointed not to see a 5% increase in funding to the developmental sector in the recent spring budget, we were heartened to see the sector pull together and advocate not only for increases to the base budgets (something that has been almost non-existent for the past 30 years), but also an increase in funding for families through the Special Service at Home Program, Individualized Funding, and Passports. We plan







to further our advocacy efforts on the Day at Legislature on May 08th.

May is Community Living Month, and we are thrilled that the Region of Durham has agreed to light up the Regional Headquarters in Community Living colours (blue and green) on May 01. They also play to proclaim May as Community Living Month on their website and on their social media feeds. It is great to see our partners sharing the message about authentic inclusion of people who have an intellectual disability. Our advocates group presented to Ajax Town Council on April 15th and asked them to do the same. On May 23 were are hosting a BBQ at Dowty to celebrate.

And finally, we are currently seeking a new board member, ideally someone with a finance background. Our board typically meets 10 times a year and, as a governance board, provides leadership, oversight, and support to the organization throughout the year. 
I am looking forward to seeing folks as the weather improves and we plan several events at CLAPW.

#5 to Survive Campaign Update

Thank you to everyone who participated in the #5tosurvive campaign. Collectively, across the province we sent more than 11,000 letters to Premier Ford, Minister Parsa and local MPP's including the Finance Minister Peter Bethlenfalvy. While we did not see the 5% increase we were asking for (which is disappointing given that we have only seen a 3.9% increase to agency base budgets in the past 30 years), we did see some financial commitments which will have a positive impact on people who have intellectual disabilities.

Key highlights from the 2024 Provincial budget include:

- Children, Community and Social Services: \$310 million over three years to community organizations that support vulnerable populations, which includes people with developmental disabilities, among other groups.
- Ontario Autism Program: \$120 million funding increase, which is double the amount provided in the 2023-24 fiscal year. This investment is to increase enrollment, improve access to supports such as applied behaviour analysis therapy, speech-language and occupational therapy, and mental health services for children and youth with autism.
- **Special Education:** \$18 million investment to support the most vulnerable students, which includes an \$8 million investment to help students with special needs navigate the education system and transitioning out of it and another \$10 million is earmarked specifically for higherneeds students.
- **Mental Health Services:** an additional \$396 million over three years to support access and expanding mental health and addiction services. This is in addition to the original \$3.8 billion over 10 years announced previously.

We are in the last months of our current Strategic Plan. Work is already underway on the next plan which will guide our work for the coming four years. We are pleased to be working with Little Dynamo Consulting on this project.

Key Achievements

- Transformation of day services including the addition of evening and weekend activities.
- Introduction of transitional aged youth summer and March Break programs.
- Strengthened relationships with post secondary education providers.
- Enhanced staff training focusing on rights, relationships, community access and system reform.
- Addition of a Case Manager to provide enhanced family supports with a focus on future planning.
- Creation of a family group.
- Expansion of supports to families through the brokering of Passports Funding.
- Expansion of the Host Family Program.
- Expansion of the Supported Independent Living Program.
- Increased advocacy with regional and provincial elected officials.
- Leadership around housing initiatives and increased partnerships with housing experts in Durham.
- Increased brand recognition and increased community partnerships.
- Receipt of a number of awards including the Accessibility Award from CLO, Accessibility Award from the Region of Durham, Prism Team Coaching Award, Town of Ajax Volunteer Award, as well as several others.
- Diversified funding sources including grants and donations.

Supported Independent Living Meals

We have been in the kitchen at Dowty! We are delighted to announce that The Community Participation Program received a Partnership grant from the Town of Ajax for \$3,000!

Through the months of January to April we gathered in the Dowty kitchen. The SIL Cooking team rolled up our sleeves and tapped into our inner Julia Child twice a week! Alternating groups of 4 participants successfully prepared 24 recipes, ranging from unstuffed cabbage rolls to lemon chicken orzo soup!

The team provided meals for 22 people which were labelled and packaged for pick up. Cindy St. James and Chris Bennett, two members of our SIL Team, were greeted with a full freezer every Tuesday and Thursday. Holiday meals, such as Christmas and Easter, were provided by the SIL Cooking groups.

This grant from the Town of Ajax was beneficial in so many ways for the folks at Community Living Ajax-Pickering and Whitby. Dowty participants travelled to the grocery store each week with DSP Betty to obtain supplies. The groups worked together to organize grocery lists, purchase ingredients, and oversee the transactions. Shout out to staff member Shonda Taitt-Dwyer for creating the SIL Meals Calendar for documenting meals!

Every Monday and Friday Morning, alternating cooking groups worked to prep vegetables, practice their kitchen safety skills and hygiene. Along with practicing our craft, we have a stack of delicious recipes participants are eager to repeat for their loved ones. We are optimistic the team will provide another 100 meals by the end of April!




Comicon

Legal Tips From Pooran Law:

Siblings May Now Manage an RDSP for a Beneficiary Who is not Capable of Being Their Own Plan Holder

The federal government has extended a measure allowing qualifying family members to open an RDSP for an adult beneficiary who does not have capacity to contract, and who does not have a guardian or attorney for property. The temporary measure <u>was set to expire at the end of 2023</u> and is now extended to December 31, 2026.

The government has also broadened the definition of "qualifying family member" to include not only a parent, spouse, or common law partner of the RDSP beneficiary, <u>but also an adult sibling of the beneficiary</u>.

While the measure does not go far enough in ensuring access to the RDSP for people with disabilities, this is a step in the right direction and presents families with additional planning options, short of guardianship.
