- Journey to Belonging, Family Initiatives/Engagements
- Transformation from Based Funding to Individualized Funding/Support
- Ministry is in consultation phase, meeting with Tech Table (21 members) ie Service Reps, Developmental Services Agencies, etc., for more Individualized Budgets. Meetings are 2 times per month until June 2025. Results will be available at later date.

- Sean Pegg, Director of Social Policy.
- ➤ Research Project on Education for Students with Special Needs. Crisis in the classroom; Restraints, Time Out's, Expulsions Report due out next week
- May is Community Living month. Policy Webinar's, May 27, Queen's Park.
- Waiting to Belong Over 52,000 Adults, as of September 2024, for critical supports.
- #5 To Survive 2024 short term advocacy effort, Budget. Request to Government, 5% to keep lights on! Financial crisis impacting the structure resulted in a 3% increase to Developmental Services. \$310,000 for organizations funded by MCCSS. First time since 2018.

- Challenge, Creating awareness within the public and government.
- 35,000 people in service with 52,000 waiting for service.
- Next steps: long term strategy, set incremental goals, articulate a vision for long-term success.
- New Hire Teresa Kruze, Media Strategist for CLO to create a Family Portal.
- Strong unified voice to bring people together, sharing messages to MPP's across the Province.
- Minister Parsa Ministry Advisory Table, 15 Agencies at Table, but no family advocates. This was because the focus was on budgets, government tech table, selected by government.
- Families need more input!
