#### STRATEGIC PLANNING

On Tuesday June 22 representatives from across CLAPW participated in a full day of Strategic Planning. This was a virtual event and was attended by twenty people with a good representation of agency stakeholders including parents, program participants, direct support staff, board members and managers.

A full day of planning done virtually can be daunting, but we are working with an excellent facilitator, Michelle Chambers of Chambers and Associates, and had the opportunity to be involved in small group discussions, white board activities as well as large group discussions. Strategic Planning is vitally important to organizations like CLAPW, and this is even more pronounced at a time when the pandemic has caused so much upheaval and uncertainty.

The planning committee did some preliminary work by conducting a PEST analysis. This involves looking at the Political, Economic, Social/Cultural and Technological implications that may influence our work over the next few years. The committee met again on August 16 and our goal is to have the final Strategic Plan (2021-2024) ready for presentation to our agency membership at the AGM on September 27, 2021.

Key areas of focus will include resource development, staffing strategy, enhanced individualized support strategy, continuous learning/mentoring, innovative living arrangements and strengthening family supports. Some of the topics are similar to our previous plan. And while we made good progress towards the objectives specified in that plan, the pandemic caused some of the work to remain incomplete.

We are in the business of helping people to have good lives and ensuring the agency has a solid plan that aligns to our mission, vision and values is a critical part of this work.

We are officially in the dog days of summer. It has been nice to be able to "open things up a bit" as the numbers of COVID 19 circulating in the community were low. That coupled with high vaccination rates helps to provide reassurance as people get back to some of their previous routines. It has not been easy for anyone, and we continue to be thankful to our dedicated staff and inspired by the people we support who have adapted so readily to the many changes.

We are pleased to have taken a lead on Rapid Antigen Testing. This provides another layer of protection and certainty. We are currently regularly testing staff, supported people and will offer this service to families who are visiting and contractors who must be inside an association location.

One of my favourite events of the year is the annual garden judging contest. (I love to garden) The creativity shown by each location was fantastic and our homes are some of the nicest looking homes in the neighbourhoods in which they are located.

Our summer program has been very successful again this year. It is amazing what can be done on a virtual platform. We have been fortunate to have 11 great, hardworking summer students that have helped with everything from programming and promotions to archive management and maintenance. We appreciate their efforts and hard work.

We are winding up year one of our three-year Trillium grant with a focus on one-to-one volunteer matches to reduce social isolation and had a very favourable evaluation. Which, when you think about it, is quite something to achieve during the midst of a global pandemic that required sheltering at home and maintaining physical distancing.

We created a Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Committee as well as a Community Wellness Committee. Both groups are comprised of Managers and Direct Support Professionals. These groups will help us continue in our efforts to ensure that CLAPW is a welcoming, dynamic, and supportive workplace.

The week of September 12-18 is Direct Support Professionals Week, and we are once again hosting our annual staff scavenger hunt during that week. Always a lot of fun, this event is open to all staff at CLAPW. We have discovered that we have very creative, fun-loving, and competitive people at CLAPW!

I, along with other local Executive Directors of Developmental Service Agencies, have been meeting with local MPP's to discuss the needs in our sector including the maintenance of the wage enhancement and the need for more services to address the numbers of people currently awaiting support. As well, we took time to discuss how well our sector weathered the Covid 19 Pandemic, thanks in large part to our philosophy about supporting people in small settings and the dedication, and commitment of our staff who adhered rigidly to infection prevention and control measures.

Looking ahead to the fall we are busy planning for our Virtual AGM to be held on September 27 (details to follow soon) and our virtual Christmas Party to be held on December 10. And of course, we are slowly reopening our day services.

#### **CHRISTMAS IN JULY**




The last year has been hard on everyone, but Christmas was particularly difficult for our Harman home this year.

# THANK YOU TO OUR VOLUNTEERS






Based on the survey input of participants, their families and the volunteers involved, the **Reducing Social Isolation Through Volunteerism** program, funded by the Ontario Trillium Foundation (OTF) and sponsored by Community Living AjaxPickering and Whitby (CLAPW), was a resounding success in its first year of operation, which began in July of 2020. Participants reported that they reached their most important goal, whether it was feeling less alone, being more connected to their

community, having someone to talk to, making more friends or talking to more people.

Several volunteers and families provided complimentary comments about the program. One volunteer noted: "The CLAPW experience was one of the most valuable experiences that I have had, and I am grateful for it." A family member observed: "It is a great program and a very worthwhile experience for our daughter."

The stakeholders have spoken. In their view, the Reducing Social Isolation Through Volunteerism program met all its goals. It provided meaningful activities for participants; the activities were of the participants' choosing; the activities fulfilled the most important goals of each participant; they were as frequent as the participants wanted; and the volunteers and participants were well-supported by CLAPW.

We look forward to what year two of this very important project will bring.


